- NBME site visit spearheaded by Dr. Lotze and chaired by ASCO Professional Development member Jim Stewart, MD
- Dr. Lotze presented the project and its importance to the PDC in September at a working dinner
- The PDC gave formal support at the next day's session for more involvement with medical student testing, training and recruitment

ASCO Action Items

- Submit PDC approved proposal to Finance/ASCO BOD to sponsor a stakeholder's meeting
- Partner with CABTRAC, U Pittsburgh and Boston University to write a final report on the NBME USMLE visit
- Support the NBME Stemmler grant application
- Expand beyond teaching/curriculum to recruitment
- Participate in scholarly activities (grants/papers)
