Plans for 2015/2016

- ASCO Work: Teleconference with ASCO to assess NBME Strategy, Karen Antman
- Doctor²: Plan for MD/PhD MSTP Session at 2016 Meeting
- Big Tent: Bring Clinical T32's to the 2016 Meeting
- International Training: Consider working with Canada/German groups to assess how education for Oncology training is done there and bring to 2016 Meeting

American Society of Clinical Oncology: Medical Students

ASCO-Sponsored Cancer Interest Groups (CIGs) – Launched in 2015

- Purpose: To engage medical students interested in the field of oncology and to support their efforts to:
 - Launch and/or grow their cancer interest group; and
 - Increase medical students' exposure to this rewarding field.
- **Includes \$500 in support funds and access to ASCO resources**
- 30 ASCO-Sponsored Cancer Interest Groups funded

American Society of Clinical Oncology: Medical Students

Medical Student Rotation Award – Launched in 2009

- **Purpose:** To provide clinical or clinical research rotations for medical students from populations underrepresented in medicine who are interested in a career on oncology.
- The award includes a mentoring component with recipients paired with oncologists who provide onsite guidance during the rotation.
- Awardee receives a \$5,000 stipend and a \$1,500 travel allowance to attend the ASCO Annual Meeting in Chicago.
- The mentor receives \$2,000 for mentor support.

American Society of Clinical Oncology: Residents

Resident Travel Award – Launched in 2009

- Purpose: To provide financial support to residents from underrepresented populations interested in a possible career in oncology to attend ASCO's Annual Meeting .
- Awardee receives a \$1,500 travel allowance and complimentary ASCO Annual Meeting registration

American Society of Clinical Oncology: Medical Students

ASCO Diversity Mentoring Program – Launched in 2013

- Purpose: To foster relationships between physicians-in-training and experienced oncology professionals who can provide career and educational guidance.
- Primarily designed for medical students and residents from populations underrepresented in medicine.

American Society of Clinical Oncology: Early-Career Oncologists

Young Investigator Award (YIA)

- One-year, \$50,000
- Purpose: Provides research funding to **physicians** to support the transition from final years of training to faculty appointment and to encourage and promote quality research in clinical oncology.
- Eligibility: Physicians in the last two years of final subspecialty training at an academic institution able to commit more than 60% of full-time effort in research.

American Society of Clinical Oncology: Early-Career Oncologists

Career Development Award

- Three-year, \$200,000
- Purpose: Provides research funding to clinical investigators who have received their initial faculty appointment as they establish an independent clinical cancer research program.
- Eligibility: Physicians in the first to third year of full-time, primary faculty appointment able to commit more than 50% of full-time effort in research
