



CANCER EPIGENETICS TRAINING PROGRAM

VAI's Cancer Epigenetics Training (CET) Program prepares postdoctoral fellows to become independent research leaders in the field of cancer epigenetics. The program offers:

- Interdisciplinary research training in cancer epigenetics
- Funding for three years that totals over \$230,000 and includes conference travel funds
- One-on-one mentorship from a team of faculty
- Extensive and individualized professional development
- Integration with established translational research programs and partnerships led by VAI investigators
- Access to outstanding Core Technologies and Services

Eligibility: Applicants must be within 12 months of completing a Ph.D., M.D., or other appropriate terminal degree. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents. Individuals who identify as members of an underrepresented racial and/or ethnic group (as defined by the National Institutes of Health) are strongly encouraged to apply.
